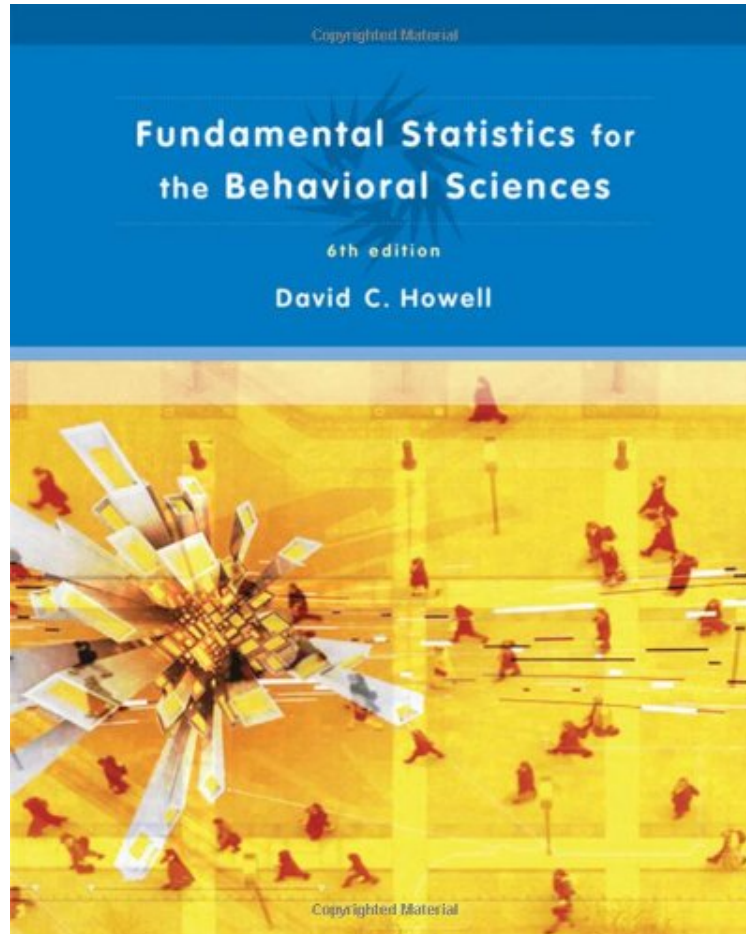

David Howell's textbook is hands down the best textbook I've ever used for teaching undergraduate statistics courses. It has the ideal balance between technical details and basic material for undergraduates. There is enough detail that concepts are explained very well, but not so much that students get bogged down in details and can't focus on the logic of what they are learning. The textbook examples are very good and taken from published studies. And

the website has additional material, datasets to download for lab assignments, and applets for 'seeing' statistical concepts in action. The current edition is edition 7. My only minor criticism is that I have uncovered a number of typos that I would have thought would have been corrected by a 7th edition. This provides you with an understanding of the logic behind the statistics: why and how certain methods are used rather than just doing techniques by rote. Professor Howell's primary area of research is in statistics and experimental methods. He is also the author of *STATISTICAL METHODS FOR PSYCHOLOGY*, currently in an Eighth Edition (Wadsworth Cengage Learning, 2013), and the *ENCYCLOPEDIA OF STATISTICS IN BEHAVIOR SCIENCE* (2005) with Brian Everitt. Before retiring, he frequently served as consultant with other faculty, both in the psychology department and in departments as disparate as Geology and Animal Sciences, and brings those experiences to this endeavor. Professor Howell's other interests include computing and the World Wide Web, and how technology affects communication, teaching, and research.
