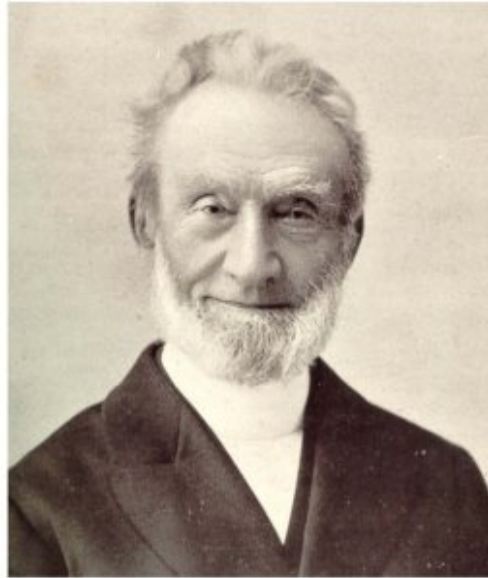

He also established 117 schools which offered Christian education to over 120,000 children, many of them being orphans.
