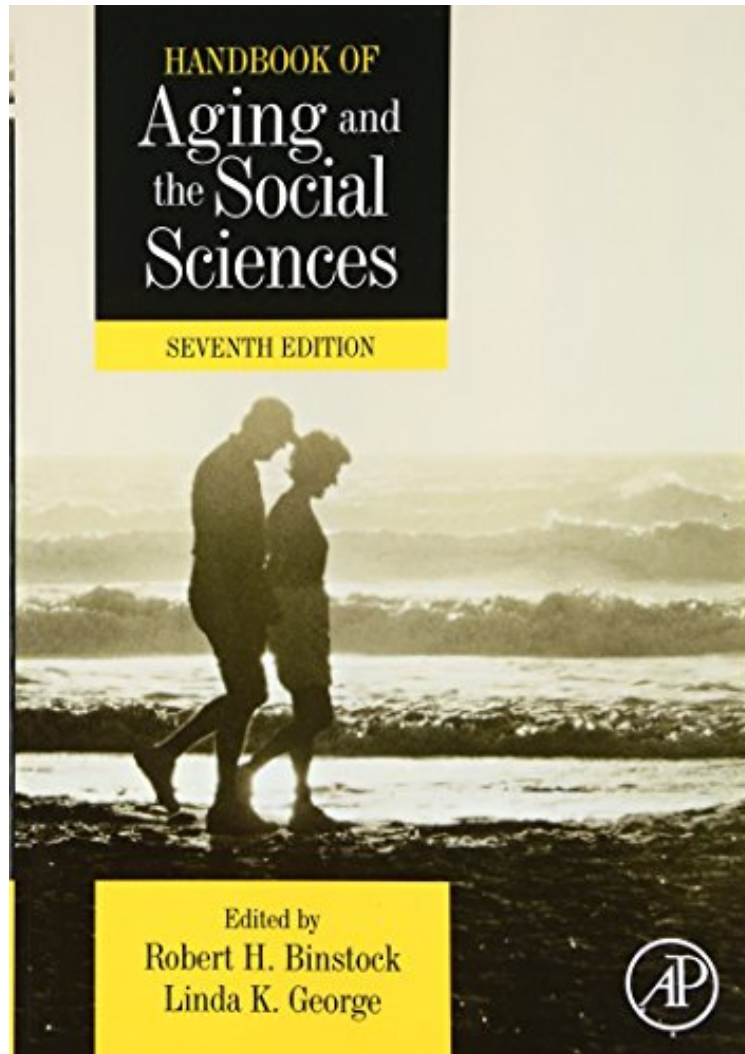

Professor George is the author or editor of eight books and author of more than 250 journal articles and book chapters. She co-edited the third, fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh editions of the *Handbook of Aging and the Social Sciences*. Her major research interests include social factors and illness, stress and social support, and mental health and well-being across the life course.
