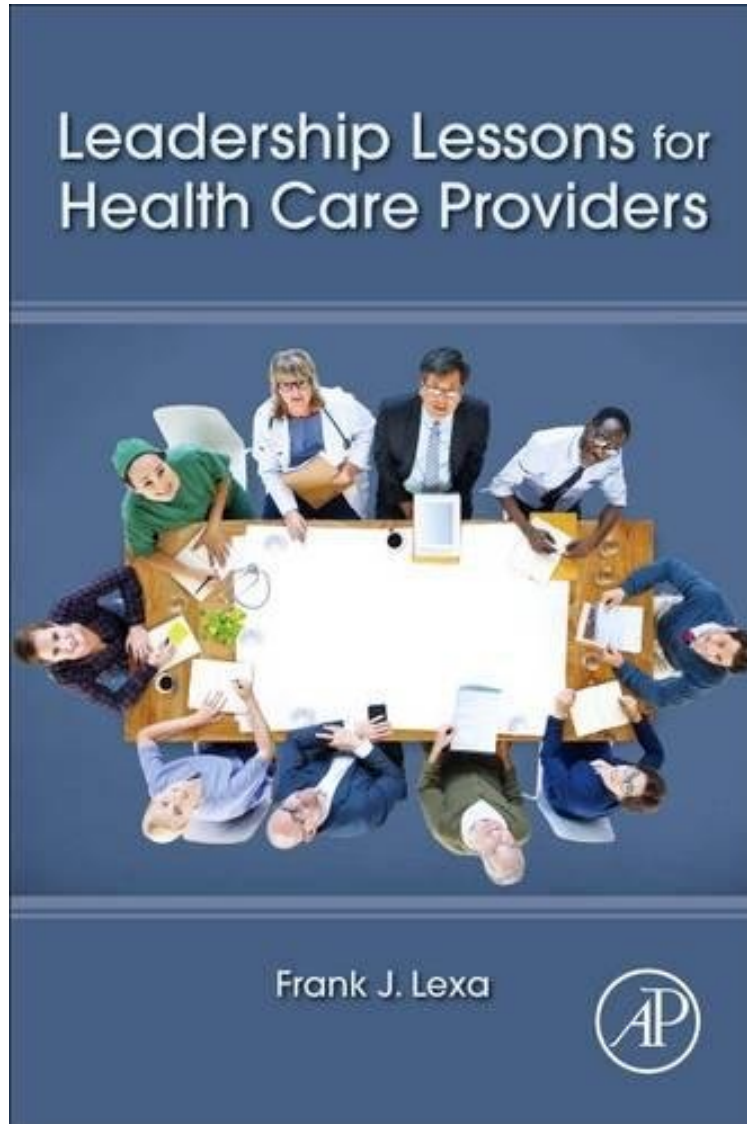

occasional "palace intrigue." Where Dr. Margolis, former Chair of Radiology at UCSF, indulged his own narcissistic fantasies about leadership, as if chairing an academic department of radiology was akin to being appointed as the king of Camelot (for example, Dr. Margolis advice to would-be chairs included an admonition to never serve VSOP-grade cognac, only XO), Dr. Lexa provides real insight and practical guidance for those who are, or would become, leaders in healthcare today. Dr. Lexa approaches the topic with clear eyes, a deep understanding of what leadership entails, and a strong (Wharton MBA) background in business and management. This is the "no-BS" version of how you can prepare to become the type of leader a modern healthcare organization needs now, and also provides a great overview of the daunting challenges that you will face if you take a leadership role in your organization.
